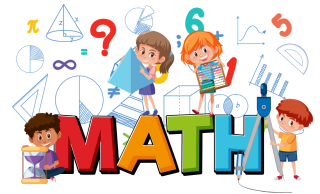

Numeracy News



NUMERACY

It has been a busy and exciting term across our primary years, with a strong focus on building mathematical confidence, problem-solving skills, and targeted support for all learners.

Targeted Support and Extension

Throughout this term, selected students from Years 1–5 have been participating in both Intervention and Extension groups. These sessions have provided additional support for students needing consolidation, as well as opportunities for extension for those ready to deepen their understanding.

We look forward to launching new groups in Term 3, ensuring the teaching support continues to be responsive to student needs.

Problem Solving in the Classroom

Across all year levels, teaching teams have been intentionally embedding problem-solving tasks into weekly mathematics lessons. This approach allows students to:

- Apply their mathematical knowledge in real-life contexts
- Develop critical and creative thinking skills
- Work collaboratively and explain their reasoning
- Build perseverance when tackling unfamiliar challenges

It has been wonderful to see students engaging deeply, asking questions, and exploring multiple strategies to reach solutions.

Working with Our MAV Math Consultant

This term, our staff have been working closely with Jess, our Mathematical Association of Victoria (MAV) consultant. Jess has:

- Provided valuable feedback to strengthen lesson planning
- Supported teams in designing rich mathematical tasks
- Coached teachers in refining their instructional practice
- Her expertise has been instrumental in helping us continue to improve the quality of numeracy teaching across the school and student outcomes.

Year 5 TIMSS Assessment

Earlier this term, our Year 5 students participated in the TIMSS (Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study) Assessment. This international assessment measures students' mathematical and scientific knowledge and understanding.

We are currently awaiting the results, which will provide valuable insights into our students' learning and help inform future teaching and learning directions.

Try This at Home! (Family Challenge)

Here's a fun and achievable challenge you can try together:

"I am thinking of a number. When I double it and add 6, I get 20. What number am I thinking of?"

Can you solve it? Try explaining your thinking in more than one way!

Thank you for your continued support in helping your child develop their numeracy skills. We look forward to another exciting term of learning ahead!

School Start Time and Punctuality

At Glenroy West Primary School, we ask that your child is at school by 8.50am to begin their learning day with teacher instruction beginning at 9am sharp. School start times are critical to student punctuality, discipline, responsibility and respect for learning routines.

The role of Punctuality

Punctuality is not just about time; it is a vital life skill that signals respect for teachers and peers, fostering a collaborative, safe and positive school environment. Conversely, poor punctuation can lead to disrupted learning and a lower sense of school connectedness.

At Glenroy West Primary School, we ask that your child is at school by 8.50am to begin their learning day with teacher instruction beginning at 9am sharp. School start times are critical to student punctuality, discipline, responsibility and respect for learning routines.

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Maximising Learning Opportunities- being on time ensures that students do not miss out on crucial learning opportunities. The beginning of the school day at 9am is Reading, followed by Writing at 10am, Our Mathematics lesson begins at 11.35am after the first break.

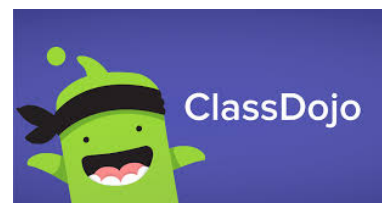

2B'S

Numeracy Learning Journey

During Term 2, the students in 2B embarked on an exciting learning journey as they developed their understanding of multiplicative thinking through multiplication and division.

They began by exploring multiplication as repeated addition, using strategies such as skip counting on number lines and grouping everyday objects into equal sets.

Through regular practice and hands-on learning experiences, students became more confident in recognising multiplication patterns and learning their times table facts.

Students enjoyed participating in a range of engaging games and activities that helped build fluency and efficiency when recalling multiplication facts.

They focused on doubles, halving, and the 2, 5 and 10 times tables, developing both accuracy and confidence along the way.

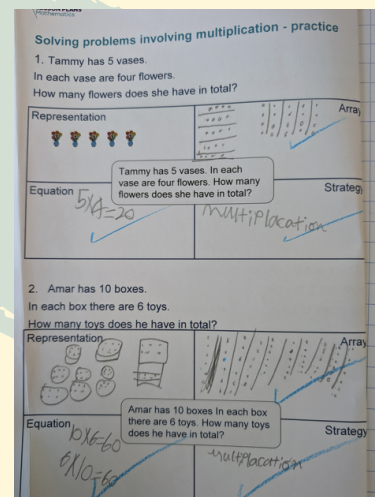
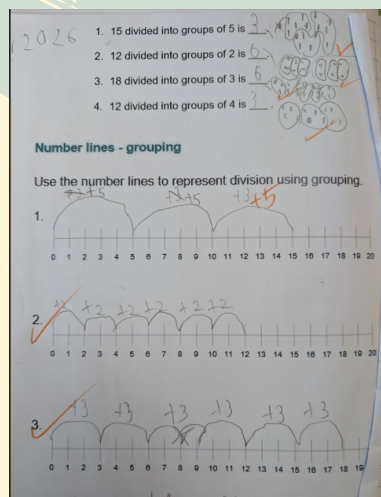
As their learning journey continued, students explored division as equal sharing.

They strengthened their understanding through a variety of experiences, including role-playing equal-sharing situations, drawing and representing multiplication and division using equal groups and arrays, and recording their thinking using mathematical equations.

Through these rich learning experiences, students developed a deeper understanding of the connection between multiplication and division and how these operations work together. We are incredibly proud of the persistence, enthusiasm and growth that the students have demonstrated throughout their Numeracy learning journey this term.
