Principal's Message

Message from the Principal

Dear Parents & Guardians,

I hope everyone is well and I look forward to working with you in 2026. It has been lovely to have a chat before and after school with each and every one of you.

I certainly enjoyed time away to relax on the Mornington Peninsula and further North Queensland where we experienced monsoonal weather and daily warm temperatures. Many outdoor swimming and sometimes challenging boating activities were enjoyed with family.

Welcome back for the first term of 2026. I hope you enjoyed your holidays with family and friends inclusive of relaxation time to recharge the batteries ready to begin a new year.

It has been welcome back week at GWPS. All staff returned on Tuesday 27th January.

We had a very positive start on Tuesday with leadership introduced our key focus of aligning our school values (Respect, Responsibility, Integrity, Excellence) with consistent expectations for learning and social behaviours, the key framework delivered by DET and the Berry Street Education Model and supported by relevant resourcing. We also devoted 3 hours of the day with professional learning with Ann our Writing Consultant to focus on student handwriting and spelling.

On Wednesday 28th January it was a bright start for Term 1 for all students Foundation to Year 6. The Foundation students began their first day of schooling to shine as the starting stars! The first day of primary school is always a special one for families and we are thrilled to be a part of it. The Prep students will be attending fulltime this week, except for Wednesdays when they have 1:1 assessment with their classroom teachers.

In week 2, we have begun our daily teaching and learning structures in Foundation to Year 6 in Reading, Writing and Numeracy inclusive of our specialist subjects of LOTE (Spanish, Music, PE & STEM). The students have settled back into routine very well and I am very pleased with the tone of the school.

We are also addressing DET PCMS (Positive Classroom Management Strategies) which aligns with our SWPBS (School Wide Positive Behaviour Support) program to create a purposeful learning environment. These 8 practices support student learning and wellbeing while managing and preventing and managing disruptive behaviours. This term we are focussing on lining up and exiting the classroom, the value of respect, silence and listening.

Construction- During the holidays we completed concrete works, gardening maintenance and improvements to our landscaped garden areas. The outside areas of the school are near completion which has been our maintenance plan over the last two years.

School Start Time and Punctuality

At Glenroy West Primary School, we ask that your child is at school by 8.50am to begin their learning day with teacher instruction beginning at 9am sharp. School start times are critical to student punctuality, discipline, responsibility and respect for learning routines.

The role of Punctuality

Punctuality is not just about time; it is a vital life skill that signals respect for teachers and peers, fostering a collaborative, safe and positive school environment. Conversely, poor punctuation can lead to disrupted learning and a lower sense of school connectedness.

Maximising Learning Opportunities- being on time ensures that students do not miss out on crucial learning opportunities. The beginning of the school day at 9am is Reading, followed by Writing at 10am, Our Mathematics lesson begins at 11.35 after the first break.

Respect for Others- punctuality is a form of respect, not only for oneself but also for others. When students arrive on time, they show consideration for their teachers, classmates, and the overall school community. This respect fosters a positive and collaborative learning environment, contributing to a culture of mutual understanding and support.

Reducing stress and anxiety- punctuality helps in reducing stress and anxiety for both students and educators. Late arrivals disrupt the flow of the lesson which may cause unnecessary distractions and impacting the overall learning experience. A well organised and punctual start to the day sets a positive tone for the entire school community.

Let us encourage and emphasise the importance of punctuality, as it lays the groundwork for a successful and fulfilling future. If you have any concerns or questions, please don't hesitate to contact your child's teacher or a member of the Leadership team.

Attendance Requirements

Same Day notification of unexplained student absences

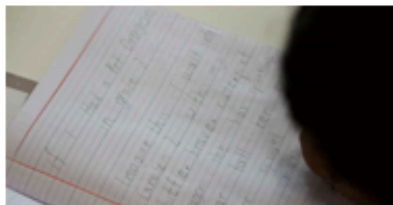
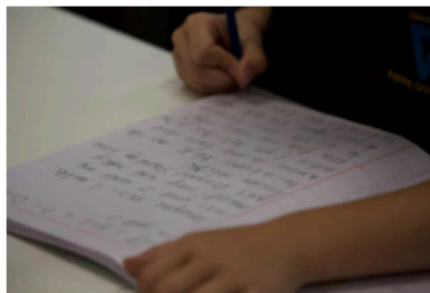

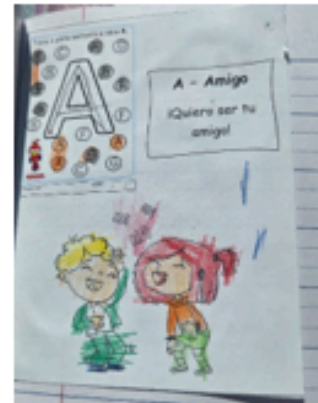
